MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION (MoA)

CENTRAL INSTITUTE OF BUDDHIST STUDIES

Government of India

Ministry of Culture

(Registered under the J&K Society's Registration Act. 1998 (1941 AD)

Registered in Leh in 1964

1.	Name of the Society	The name of the Society shall be "Society of Central Institute of Buddhist Studies, Leh".
2	Name of the Institution Deemed to be University along with its constituent units	The name of Institution shall be "Central Institute of Buddhist Studies, Leh".
3	Office of the Society Deemed to be University	The registered office/headquarters of the Society Deemed to be University shall be at Central Institute of Buddhist Studies, Choglamsar, Leh-Ladakh (J&K).
4	Objectives	The Society shall undertake Under Graduate, Post Graduate and Doctoral Programmes in Buddhist Philosophical and Cultural Studies and may also establish and maintain feeder schools. The Objectives for which the Society is established are:
	1	To provide higher education leading to excellence and innovations in such branches of knowledge as may be deemed fit primarily at post-graduate and research degree levels fully conforming to the concept of university, namely, University Education Report (1948) and the Report of the Committee on Renovation and Rejuvenation of Higher Education in India (2009) and the Report of the Review Committee for Deemed to be Universities (2009).
	2	To engage in areas of specialization with proven ability to make distinctive contributions to the objectives of the university education system that is – academic engagement clearly distinguishable from programmes of an ordinary nature that lead to conventional degrees in arts, science, engineering, medicine, dental, pharmacy, management etc., routinely offered by conventional institutions.

		3	To provide for high quality teaching and research and for the advancement of knowledge and its dissemination through various research programmes undertaken in-house by substantial number of full time faculty / research scholars (Ph.Ds and Post Doctoral) in diverse disciplines.
		4	To develop, manage, supervise and administer the affairs of the educational institution called the Central Institute of Buddhist Studies, Choglamsar, earlier known as the School of Buddhist Philosophy.
		5	To provide instruction for various courses of study and for research in different branches of Buddhist Philosophical and Cultural Studies for the award of the degrees and diplomas.
		6	To provide facilities for research, publication, restoration and advancement of learning and dissemination of knowledge in such branches of Buddhist Philosophy as the Society may think fit.
		7	To co-operate with educational and other institutions in any part of the world having objectives similar to those of the Institute in such manner as may be conducive to their common objectives.
		8	To invite scholars of Buddhist Philosophy and Cultural Studies from India and other countries for lectures, and to hold seminars, discussions and discourses in Buddhist Philosophy and Culture.
		9	To do all such things as may be necessary incidental or conducive to the attainment of all or any of the objectives of the Society.
5	Definitions		In these Rules and Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires:
		1	“Act” means the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (Act 3 of 1956).
		2	“Campus” means Campus of the institution deemed to be university as its headquarters, wherein its major facilities, faculty, staff, students and its Academic Departments are located in a city/town/village in India. An ‘off-Campus Centre’ means an approved (by the Central Government) centre of the institution deemed to be university beyond its Campus in the country. An ‘off-shore

			Campus' means an approved (by the Central Government) centre of the institution deemed to be university beyond its Campus and outside India.
		3	"Government" means the Central Government, unless the context so specifies.
		4	"Board" shall mean the Board of Management of the Central Institute of Buddhist Studies, Choglamsar, Leh-Ladakh, J&K.
		5	"Chairman" shall mean the Chairman referred to in these rules.
		6	"Chancellor" shall mean the Chancellor of the Central Institute of Buddhist Studies, Choglamsar, Leh-Ladakh, J&K.
		7	"Commission" shall mean the University Grants Commission (UGC).
		8	"Central Government" shall mean the Ministry of Culture, Government of India.
		9	"Funds" shall mean the funds of the Board of Management of the Central Institute of Buddhist Studies, Choglamsar, Leh-Ladakh (J&K) including movable and immovable properties.
		10	"Institute" shall mean the Central Institute of Buddhist Studies, Choglamsar, Leh, Ladakh (J&K).
		11	"Member" shall mean the members of the Society/Board of Management referred to in these rules.
		12	"Society" shall mean the "Society of Central Institute of Buddhist Studies, Leh".
		13	"Secretary" shall mean the Member-Secretary of the Society/Board of Management referred to in these rules.
		14	"Vice Chancellor" shall mean the Vice Chancellor of the Central Institute of Buddhist Studies, Choglamsar, Leh-Ladakh, J&K.
		15	"Year" shall mean the period of 12 calendar months beginning from the 1st day of April and ending on the 31 st day of March of the subsequent year.
6	Powers and Functions		A draft of the Annual Report and the yearly accounts of the Society shall be placed before the Society in its Annual General Meeting (AGM) for its consideration

		and approval. The Society shall guide, supervise and oversee the overall functioning of the Institute.
7	Governance System	<p>The Institution to be declared as a deemed to be university shall adhere to the following criteria:</p> <p>1 The proposed institution deemed to be university shall be registered as a not-for-profit Society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 (hereinafter referred to as the Managing Society), which shall be owned by a not-for-profit Society registered under the Societies Registration Act. (hereinafter referred to as the Sponsoring Society), or in case of a public funded deemed to be university, by the Government: Provided that the members of a Managing Society of a deemed to be a university, not being a public funded deemed to be a university, shall not be directly or indirectly connected with the members of the sponsoring Society”.</p> <p>2 Among the authorities of the deemed to be university, there shall be a Chancellor who shall be appointed by the sponsoring Society. He/she shall be an eminent educationist or a distinguished public figure other than the President of the sponsoring Society or his/her close relatives.</p> <p>3 There shall be no position of Pro-Chancellor(s).</p> <p>4 The highest governing body of the deemed to be university shall be a Board of Management to be headed by the Vice-Chancellor. This body shall consist of a minimum of ten members and a maximum of fifteen members.</p> <p>5 The Board of Management of the institution shall be independent of the sponsoring Society with full autonomy to perform its academic and administrative responsibilities. The number of representative(s) / nominee(s) of the sponsoring Society on the Board of Management shall be limited to a maximum of four.</p> <p>6 The Board of Management shall consist of eminent persons capable of contributing to and upholding university ideals and traditions.</p> <p>7 There shall be a Board of Management consisting of the following:</p>

		iii	Deans of Faculties not exceeding two (by rotation based on seniority)	Members

		The term of membership of the Board of Management and its powers are as shown in the Rules and Regulations of the Institute.		
		8	The Vice-Chancellor shall be an eminent academic and shall be appointed in the manner laid down under clause 6.2 in Annexure 2 of UGC Regulations 2014.	
		9	All other statutory bodies of the deemed to be university shall be as described in the Rules and Regulations of the Institute.	
		10	Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, the governance system and management structure of a public funded institution Deemed to be University may be in accordance with the decision of the Central Government or the State Government, as the case may be.	
8	Admissions and Fees Structure	1	The institute deemed to be university shall not for admission in respect of any course or programme of study conducted in such institution, accept payment towards admission fee and other fees and	

			charges:
		(i)	other than such fee or charges for such admission as fixed in accordance with the Fee Regulations framed by the Government or by the Commission in this behalf from time to time, which shall be declared by it in the prospectus for admission against any such seat, and on the website of the institution; and
		(ii)	without a proper receipt in writing issued for such payment to the concerned student admitted in such institution.
		2	The institute deemed to be university shall not charge any fee for an admission test other than an amount representing the reasonable cost incurred by it in conducting such test: Provided further that the institute deemed to be university shall not engage in commercialization of education in any manner whatsoever, and shall provide for equity and access to all deserving students.
		3	Admission of students to the institute deemed to be university shall be made in the following manner:
		i	In case the appropriate statutory authority has specified the process of selection for admission to any course, or programme of study for the institute which includes conducting competitive admission test for ascertaining the competence of any person to pursue such course or programme of study, in that case, no person shall be admitted to such course or programme of study in such institution, except through an admission test conducted by a recognized body or such institution or a group of institutions if such institution or group of institutions have been so authorised by the Central Government or a State Government or any statutory authority.
		ii	In case the process of selection for admission to any course or programme of study in the institute including conducting competitive admission test has not been specified under sub-clause (i), in that case, no person shall be eligible for admission to such course or

			programme of study in the institute except through inter se merit to be specified in the prospectus of the institute :
			Provided that admission of Non-Resident Indians (NRI)/Persons of Indian Origin (PIO)/Foreign students to institutions deemed to be universities shall be governed by the Guidelines/Regulations framed by the Commission in this behalf from time to time.
		4	The institute deemed to be university shall –
		i	maintain the records of the entire process of selection of candidates, and preserve such records for a minimum period of five years;
		ii	exhibit such records on its websites; and
		iii	be liable to produce such records, whenever called upon to do so by any statutory authority or by the Government under any law for the time being in force.
		5	The institute deemed to be university shall publish, before expiry of sixty days prior to the date of the commencement of admission to any of its course or programmes of study, a prospectus containing the following for the purposes of informing those persons intending to seek admission to the institute and the general public, namely :
		i	each component of the fee, deposits and other charges payable by the institute for pursuing a course or a programme of study, and the other terms and condition of such payment;
		ii	the percentage refundable to a student admitted in the institute in case such student withdraws from the institute before or after completion of course or programme of study and the time within, and the manner in, which such refund shall be made to the student;
		iii	the number of seats approved in respect of each course or programme of study for the academic year for which admission is proposed to be made;
		iv	the conditions of eligibility including the minimum and maximum age limit of persons for admission as a student in a particular

			course or programme of study, where so specified by the institute;
		v	the educational qualification specified by the relevant statutory authority/body, or by the institute, where no such qualifying standards have been specified by any statutory authority;
		vi	the process of admission and selection of eligible candidates applying for such admission, including all relevant information in regard to the details of test or examination for selecting such candidates for admission to each course or programme of study and the amount of fee to be paid for the admission test;
		vii	details of the teaching faculty, including therein the educational qualifications and teaching experience of every member of its teaching faculty and also indicating therein whether such member is on regular basis or visiting basis;
		viii	the minimum pay and other emoluments payable for each category of teachers and other employees;
		ix	information in regard to physical and academic infrastructure and other facilities including hostel accommodation, library, hospital or industry wherein the practice training to be imparted to the students and in particular the facilities accessible by students on being admitted to the institute;
		x	broad outline of the syllabus specified by the appropriate statutory body or by the institute, as the case may be, for every course or programme of study, including the teaching hours, practical sessions and other assignments;
		xi	all relevant instruction in regard to maintaining the discipline by students within or outside the campus of the institute, and, in particular, such discipline relating to prohibition of ragging of any student or students and the consequences thereof and for

			violating the provisions of any regulation in this behalf made under the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 or other law for the time being in force.
			Provided that the institute deemed to be university shall publish information referred to in items (i) to (xi) of this clause on its website, and the attention of the prospective students and the general public shall be drawn to such publication on the website through advertisements displayed prominently in the different newspapers and through other media; Provided further that the institute deemed to be university may publish prospectus in accordance with this clause at any time before the expiry of sixty days specified under this clause.
		6	The institute deemed to be university shall fix the price of each printed copy of the prospectus, being not more than reasonable cost of its publication and distribution and no profit be made out of this publication, distribution or sale of prospectus.
		7	The institute deemed to be university shall not directly or indirectly, demand or charge or accept, capitation fee or demand any donation, by way of consideration for admission to any seat or seats in a course or programme of study conducted by it.
		8	No person shall, directly or indirectly, offer or pay capitation fee or give any donation, by way of consideration either in cash or kind or otherwise, for obtaining admission to any seat or seats in a course or programme of study in the institute deemed to be university.
		9	The institute deemed to be university, who has in its possession or custody, of any document in the form of certificates of degree, diploma or any other award or other document deposited with it by a person for the purpose of seeking admission in the institute shall not refuse to return such degree, certificate award or other document with a view to induce or compel such person to pay any fee or fees in respect of any course or programme of study which such person does not intend to pursue or avail any facility in the institute.

		10	In case a student, after having admitted to the institute deemed to be university, for pursuing any course or programme of study in the institute, subsequently withdraws from the institute, the institute in that case shall not refuse to refund such percentage of fee deposited by such student and within such time as has been mentioned in the prospectus of the institute.
		11	The institute deemed to be university shall not issue or publish:
		(i)	any advertisement for inducing students for taking admission in the institution, claiming to be recognized by the appropriate statutory authority where it is not so recognized; or
		(ii)	any information, through advertisement or otherwise in respect of its infrastructure or its academic facilities or of its faculty or standard of instruction or academic or research performance, which the institute, or person authorized to issue such advertisement on behalf of the institute knows to be false or not based on facts or to be misleading.
		12	<p>On being declared an institute deemed to be university, the institute shall admit students to its approved academic programmes, under its enrolment, only from the academic session that follows the Notification issued by the Central Government:</p> <p>Provided that enrolment of students to the institute, for any reason whatsoever, in anticipation of declaration of the institute deemed to be university or inclusion of the institute under the ambit of an institute deemed to be university, shall render the application invalid:</p> <p>Provided further that the students already on the rolls of the institutes prior to the date of application for declarations as an institution deemed to be university or its inclusion under the ambit of an Institute deemed to be university shall continue to be the students, for all purposes, of the affiliating university with whom they have already been enrolled, and shall also be awarded degree only by that affiliating university.</p>

9	Maintenance Standards of	1	The Institute shall maintain standards, higher than the minimum of instruction, academic and physical infrastructure, qualifications of teachers etc., as prescribed for Graduate and Post-Graduate Research Institution by the UGC or by the statutory/regularly body concerned and shall obtain their approval for running various programmes of study wherever applicable.
		2	This shall be periodically monitored by the duly constituted committee(s) of the Commission.
10	New Departments, off-Campus Centres and off-Shore Campus shall be started by the deemed to be university only after prior approval of UGC/MHRD.	1	The Institute shall operate within its own main campus as declared by the Central Government in the notification and conduct approved programmes of study falling within the area of its specialization.
		2	If the Institute wishes to expand its programme by starting new department dealing with a subject which is not in the field of its specialization or in an allied field, covered under the objectives of the Institute for which it is established, the Department shall be started with prior approval of the Central Government/ U.G.C.
		3	The institute deemed to be university shall be allowed to operate a maximum of six off-campus beyond its approved geographical boundaries..
		4	If the Institute wishes to operate the off-campus centres and off-shore campus, it shall be started after completing formalities as prescribed in the U.G.C. guidelines and with the prior approval of the UGC/MHRD/Central Government.
11	Inclusion of other institutions under the ambit of institution deemed to be university	No new institution under the ambit of the deemed to be university shall be included without prior approval of the UGC/MHRD.	
12	Joint Programmes	1	The institute may conduct Joint Academic Programme(s) with other universities/Institution deemed to be University in India and abroad with the prior approval of the U.G.C. The proposed Joint Porgramme(s) shall conform to the Act and Rules of the proposed Commission that shall apply to such programmes from time to time.
		2	There shall be sufficient safeguards so as to protect the interests of students enrolled in such programmes.

		3	The joint programmes shall be subjected to mandatory assessment and accreditation.
13	Institute Deemed to be University open to all	1	Admission and employment in the Institute deemed to be university shall be open to all citizens of India irrespective of race, religions, caste or creed and the area/place of residence in India.
		2	All policies and procedures, as applicable to the university level Institution shall also be applicable to this Institute as deemed to be university.
14	Institute Deemed to be University to be Unitary		Once the institute is declared as a Unitary Institution Deemed to be University, it shall not affiliate any other Institution.
15	Reservation Policy		The Institute shall implement the Reservation Policy in admission, recruitment and promotion in accordance with any Act of Parliament for the time being in force.
16	Distance Education Course under distance mode shall be started only after prior approval of UGC		The Institute shall not conduct courses in the distance mode. Hence clause 18 of UGC Regulations, 2014 is not applicable.
17	Meetings of University Bodies		The Institute shall conduct meetings of all its statutory bodies, like Board of Management, Academic Council, Finance Committee, Research Committee etc., at regular interval as per the Regulations. The minutes of each such meeting shall be displayed in the website of the Institute.
18	Use of the word "University"		The Institute shall not use the word "University". However, the institute shall use the word "Deemed to be University" within the parenthesis suffixed thereto.
19	Consequences of violation of Regulations	1	The Central Government/UGC shall have right to cause an Inspection of the Institute, its buildings, laboratories, its examination, teaching and other works conducted or done by the Institute and to cause an enquiry to be made, if considered necessary in respect of any matter of the Institution deemed to be university.
		2	After conducting an inspection of the institution deemed to be university by the Commission on its own or on the basis of any other authentic information or report received from explanation submitted by the institution deemed to be university, if the Commission is satisfied that the

		<p>institution deemed to be university has violated any of the provisions of these Regulations or any directives issued by the Commission, the Commission may direct the institute deemed to be university concerned not to admit new students for the period to be decided by the Commission and in case of deliberate continuous violation of these Regulation, may advise the Central Government for withdrawal of the declaration notifying the institute as in institution deemed to be university. In the event of such withdrawal of the declaration, the entire movable and immovable properties of the institution deemed to be university shall stand transferred to the Commission. For first violation, the withdrawal may be restricted to one academic session which can be extended upto five academic sessions for repeated violations. However, for serious and deliberate violation, the status of deemed to be university shall be withdrawn permanently.</p>
		<p>“Provided that in case of a withdrawal of declaration notifying the institution as a deemed to be university of a public funded deemed to be university, the entire movable and immovable properties of the institution deemed to be university shall stand transferred to the Central Government or the State Government, as the case may be.”</p>
		<p>3 In the event of the withdrawal of the deemed university status, action shall be simultaneously initiated to protect the interests of the students according to such precedents and practices as applicable or determined for the specific situation.</p>
		<p>4 If an institution deemed to be university wishes to withdraw itself or its constituents from the status of ‘institution deemed to be university’, it may do so with the prior permission of the Central Government. Such withdrawal shall take effect only after the last batch of students then enrolled, passed out of the institution deemed to be university.</p>

		Meeting of the Society	
		1	The Society shall meet at least once in a year and whenever necessary in the interest of the Society.
		2	For every meeting of the Society one month's notice shall be given to the members. Five members including the President shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Society.
		3	In case of a difference of opinion amongst the members, the opinion of the majority shall prevail.
		4	Each member of the Society including the President shall have one vote and if there be an equality of votes on any question to be determined by the Society, the President shall in addition have and exercise a casting vote.
		5	Meeting of the Society shall be presided over by the President and, in his absence, by a member chosen from amongst members present at the meeting.
		6	Any Resolution except such as may be placed before the meeting of the Society may be adopted by circulation among all its members and any Resolution so circulated and adopted by a majority of the members who have signified their approval or disapproval of such Resolution had been adopted at a meeting of the Society, provided that in every such case at least five members of the Board shall have recorded their approval of resolution.
